**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER #26-01**

**USE OF BODY WORN CAMERAS WITHIN THE PLUMAS SUPERIOR COURT FACILITIES  
LOCATED IN THE PLUMAS COUNTY COURTHOUSE**

Effective this date and continuing until further order, the use of body-worn cameras within the Superior Court facilities located in the Plumas County Courthouse by the public is prohibited. Those Superior Court facilities include all courtrooms, Clerk's offices, judicial chambers, third floor conference room, and any and all attendant hallways and rooms.

Law enforcement and security officers are permitted to wear body-worn cameras within the Superior Court facilities. Law enforcement and security officer body-worn cameras shall be off, on standby or inactive.


**Permitted Use:** Law enforcement and security officers may use body-worn camera within the Superior Court facilities to create a recording **only** if the officer is conducting law enforcement activities or assisting with an arrest, interacting with an individual who is not complying with a command from the officer or judicial officer, is responding to an emergency situation, or has received prior permission from the Presiding Judge.

If law enforcement or security are present during juvenile proceedings and a recording is created as permitted above, they must comply with Welfare and Institutions Code section 827 and California Rules of Court rule 5.552.

If law enforcement activates a body-worn camera while in the Superior Court facilities, they shall notify the Sheriff's Department and Court Executive Officer as soon as practical.
