

FELONY GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- A. The purpose of this bail schedule is to fix an amount upon which a person who is arrested without a warrant may be released from custody prior to appearance in court. If a person is arrested pursuant to an arrest warrant, bail is set at the amount of the warrant.
- B. After a defendant's first appearance in court, the amount of bail will lie within the sound discretion of the judicial officer before whom the defendant appeared and may be greater or less than the amount set forth in this schedule, subject to the provisions of Penal Code section 1275 and controlling case law, including *In re Humphrey* (2021), 11 Cal. 5th 135. This schedule may also be used by a magistrate in fixing bail pursuant to Penal Code section 815a at the time an arrest warrant is issued, the amount of which lies in the sound discretion of the magistrate.
- C. Prevailing legislation places the burden on law enforcement agencies to notify the magistrate if the scheduled bail is not adequate for the crime. Penal Code section 1269c provides that if a defendant is arrested without a warrant for a bailable felony offense or for a misdemeanor violation of a domestic violence restraining order, and a peace officer has reasonable cause to believe that the amount of bail set forth in the schedule is insufficient to ensure the defendant's appearance or to ensure the protection of a victim, or family member of a victim, of domestic violence, the police officer shall prepare a declaration and file it with the magistrate requesting higher bail.
- D. Persons not entitled to be released on bail are those charged with:
 - 1. Capital crimes (i.e. murder with special circumstance), when the facts are evident or the presumption great. Penal Code section 1270.5 & California Constitution, Article 1, Section 12(a);
 - 2. Felony offenses involving acts of violence against another person when the facts are evident or the presumption great (i.e., substantial evidence of guilt) and the court finds based upon clear and convincing evidence that there is a substantial likelihood the person's release would result in great bodily harm to others; or
 - 3. Felony offenses when the facts are evident or the presumption great (i.e. substantial evidence of guilt) and the court finds based upon clear and convincing evidence that the person has threatened another with great bodily harm and there is a substantial likelihood that the person would carry out the threat if released. California Constitution, Article 1, Section 12(c).

- E. The bail schedule shall contain a general clause for those offenses not specifically listed in the bail schedule. For all felony offenses and enhancements not listed, the bail amount shall be set at:

\$15,000

Top term Life/LWOP – NO BAIL

- F. Penal Code section 1270.1 prohibits the release of an arrestee on bail in an amount **OTHER THAN THAT SET FORTH ON THE BAIL SCHEDULE** prior to a hearing in open court for:

1. Violent felonies as described in Penal Code section 667.5 (c), but not 460(a);
2. Serious felonies as described in Penal Code section 1192.7(c) (including those listed in Penal Code section 1192.8); and
3. Violations of Penal Code sections 136.1(c), 243(e)(1), 262, 273.5, 273.6, felony 422 and 646.9.

- G. Violation of Probation/Mandatory Supervision/Post Release Supervision/Parole – ARREST:

1. Arrest without warrant shall have NO BAIL if offense is for violating the terms of mandatory supervision, post release community service or parole.
2. BAIL will be set at NO BAIL if the offense is for violating the terms of felony probation.
3. BAIL will be set at \$15,000 if offense is for violating the terms of misdemeanor probation.

- H. The bail limit for multiple offenses shall be established as follows:

1. When a defendant is booked on two or more charges arising from the same course of conduct on the same occasion, bail shall be the amount set for the charge having the highest bail plus any enhancement.
2. When a defendant is booked on a felony with a misdemeanor or infraction, the misdemeanor/infraction bail should not be considered.

MISDEMEANOR / INFRACTION GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

A. Determining Misdemeanor Bail

1. Bail shall be determined by first using the amount set forth in this schedule. (Penal Code section 1269b(c))
2. If the violation is not specifically set forth in this schedule, then bail shall be the amount set forth in the most current publication of the Plumas County Superior Court Uniform Bail and Penalty Schedule (Rule 4.102, California Rules of Court).
3. If bail cannot be set under the provisions of number 1 and 2 above, then the bail shall be as follows:
 - a. \$2,000 for offenses with a maximum term of 1 year.
 - b. \$1,000 for offenses with a maximum term of 6 months

B. Determining Infraction Bail

1. Bail shall be determined by first using the most current publication of the Plumas County Superior Court Uniform Bail and Penalty Schedule, hereby adopted and incorporated for reference.
2. For those infractions not set forth in the Judicial Council Bail Schedule in which the statute reflects a minimum and maximum fine (e.g., "a fine of not less than XXX and not more than XXX"), the bail shall be at the minimum fine amount.
3. For those infractions not set forth in the Plumas County Uniform Bail and Penalty Schedule in which the statute reflects a "fine of not to exceed XXX" and the amount is greater than \$50, then the bail shall be set at \$50 (e.g., "a fine not to exceed \$100"). The bail shall be set at \$50, as referenced under the provisions of number 2 above.

C. Proposition 47

1. Pursuant to Proposition 47, violations of Health & Safety Code § 11350, Health & Safety Code § 11357(a), Health & Safety Code § 11377, Penal Code § 459.5 (entering a commercial establishment and taking or intending to take property not exceeding \$950), Penal Code § 470/473 (forgery where document does not exceed \$950), Penal Code § 476a (insufficient funds where checks do not exceed \$950), and Penal Code § 496 (receiving stolen property not exceeding \$950) are normally misdemeanors. However, felony bail is required for violators who are required to register pursuant to Penal Code § 290 or who have one or more prior convictions set forth in Penal Code § 667(e)(2)(C)(iv).
2. Pursuant to Proposition 47, the crimes of theft of property taken from a person's physical presence not exceeding \$950 (Penal Code § 487(c)), theft of an automobile not exceeding \$950 (Penal Code § 487(d)(1)), theft of a firearm not exceeding \$950 (Penal Code § 487(d)(2)), and petty theft with a prior (Penal Code § 666), are normally punishable as misdemeanor petty thefts. However, felony bail is required for violators who are required to register pursuant to Penal Code § 290 or who have one or more prior convictions set forth in Penal Code § 667(e)(2)(C)(iv). Felony bail is also required for petty theft with a prior if the violator has a prior conviction set forth in Penal Code § 368(d) or § 368(e)
